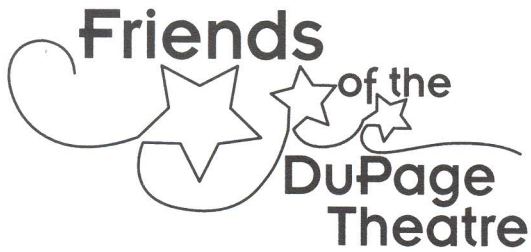

SILENT AUCTION

Auction Rules



Silent Auction Rules

1. The Silent Auction begins at 6:00pm. Categories of this auction will be closed sequentially throughout the evening. The closing times are listed in the program book and will be announced during the evening.
2. All items have bid sheets attached or displayed nearby. Minimum starting bids and required increment amounts are written on the bid sheet. Bid sheets may note certain item restrictions. Details of all restrictions and conditions that may apply to each item are noted on the bid sheet. Auction items are not exchangeable or returnable for cash.
3. Persons desiring to bid must do so by writing their name and table location and the amount of their bid on the bid sheet. To be valid, the bid must meet or exceed the minimum required increment amount and must be legible. Each new bid must be written on the topmost available line of the bid sheet. The closing bid circled by an Auction official constitutes the winning bid.
4. In the event of a dispute, or if more than one person desires an item at the closing of a category, an Auction official shall act as the final authority to determine the winning bidder and may conduct a mini-live auction. His/her decision shall be final.
5. Bids submitted after the category closing are not valid and will not be honored.
6. Successful bidders will be notified after the closing of each category.
7. Payment for items purchased must be made in full on July 25, 2003 at the cashier area, which will open after dinner. Cash, checks made payable to Friends of the DuPage Theatre, Visa, Mastercard will be accepted.
8. Successful bidders should proceed to the Cashier area to pay for purchases. Upon receiving a receipt from the cashier for each item, bidders should go to the appropriate auction area to claim their merchandise. Upon presentation of the receipt indicating payment, the Auction official will mark it received and remit purchased item or gift certificates. Bidders should retain their receipts for their tax records. All items must be transported from the Carlisle the evening of the Auction. Any bidder not making arrangements for payment in full or transport will forfeit the right to purchase the item.

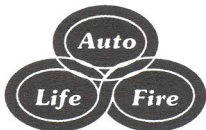

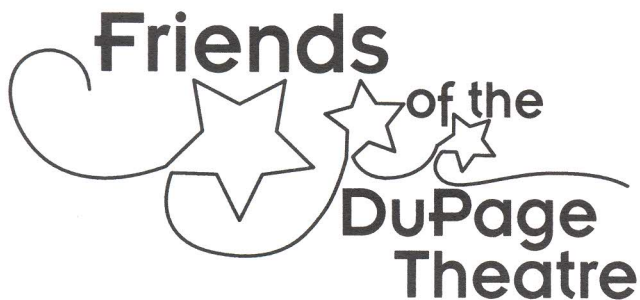

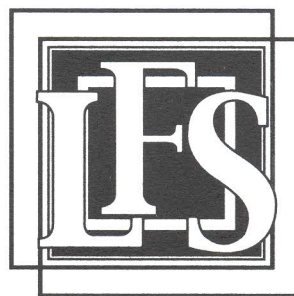
